CABA's Intelligent & Integrated Building Council (IIBC) IIBC White Papers Sub-Committee (WPSC) Terms of Reference (Revised Feb. 21, 2014)

Objectives:

- 1. Educate the CABA membership on emerging research, information, and challenges in the Intelligent & Integrated Building industry.
- 2. Improve the quality and credibility of white paper research via a peer-review process.
- 3. Foster idea sharing in accordance with anti-trust laws, which could lead to new CABA research and collaborations.
- 4. Support companies and individuals in the production of white papers through:
 - a) The formation of volunteer working groups made up of 'Subject Matter Experts'.
 - b) A formal review process that provides direction, insight, feedback, and credibility.
 - c) The identification of a suitable author(s) if required.

Process:

- 1. A white paper proposal, approximately three (3) paragraphs, must be submitted to the CABA Research Director. Only CABA members can submit a proposal. The proposal should be brief and include the purpose and main focus of the white paper.
- 2. The proposal will be reviewed by the CABA Research Director and White Paper Sub-Committee (WPSC) Chair, and if approved will be presented at the next WPSC meeting.
- 3. The WPSC meeting is a two part conference call held bi-monthly, the first part is only open to WPSC members, and invited guests. In the first part, each proposal will be given 10-15 minute for presentation and discussion. In the second part, the WPSC members will vote on all proposals and final drafts. A majority vote is needed for approval.
- 4. Once approved, CABA will help secure a working group of subject matter experts and an author(s) for each white paper. A working group is recommended, but not required. The majority of the working group should approve the white paper final draft.
- 5. A draft white paper will be developed by the author(s) and working group.
- 6. The final draft will be submitted to the CABA Research Director, who will disseminate it to the WPSC for review and approval at the next WPSC meeting.
- 7. The approved final draft will be branded a CABA Intelligent & Integrated Building Council (IIBC) White Paper and: presented at the next IIBC meeting, distributed to the CABA membership, added to the CABA Research Library, promoted at the CABA Intelligent Buildings & Digital Home Forum and other industry events.
- 8. This is approximately an eight (8) week process; from proposal presentation at a WPSC meeting to final draft approval at the next WPSC meeting.

Terms of Reference:

- 1. The CABA Intelligent & Integrated Building Council (IIBC), as directed by the CABA Board of Directors, will oversee and provide direction to the IIBC White Papers Sub-Committee (WPSC).
- 2. The CABA Research Director will serve as the project manager for all IIBC White Papers produced by the WPSC.
- 3. The WPSC will meet bi-monthly and provide update reports at each IIBC meeting. The objective is for the WPSC to produce at least four (4) white papers per year.
- 4. The WPSC is made up of IIBC member volunteers, led by a WPSC Chair. Volunteers come from a broad range of backgrounds and Intelligent Building expertise is required. There is no limit to the number of WPSC members.
- 5. IIBC members are encouraged to participate in proposing, writing, or collaborating on white papers.
- 6. IIBC White Papers are secondary or 'literature review' research that address an area of the industry applicable to some or all CABA members. This research is meant to be a collection of information of what is already known in the marketplace, and should not include primary or 'novel' research.
- 7. IIBC White Papers are approximately 10-20 pages in length are not marketing material that promotes a specific product or service.
- 8. If required, CABA staff and IIBC members will collaborate to identify a suitable author for each white paper.
- 9. Author(s) and working group members will be appropriately cited and have unrestricted use of the IIBC White Paper for promotional purposes.
- 10. A working group is recommended, but not required, for each white paper. Working groups are collections of 'Subject Matter Experts' that assist an author(s) in the development of a white paper. Both members and non-members can volunteer to be part of a working group.
- 11. IIBC White Paper proposals and final drafts must be approved by the WPSC and then formally presented at the next IIBC Meeting.
