He has served as Project Director for Richard Rogers Partnership in London and Architect for Murphy/ Jahn in Chicago where he managed master-planning, design and construction of urban developments, corporate headquarters, mixed use, transportation, education and residential buildings throughout Europe and North America. His research projects for the European Community and American organizations have focused on sustainable building design and urban development, and the impact of internet business and technology solutions on workplace and real estate strategies.

Mr. Wagener received a Ph.D. in Architecture from the West German Institute of Technology and an Advanced Management Degree in Real Estate from Harvard University. He is an extensively published author and lecturer in Asia Pacific, Europe and North America. As member of the American Institute of Architects and the Royal Institute of British Architects, he is licensed to practice architecture on both continents.
