## **BROADBAND LEGAL EXPERT JIM BALLER TO ADDRESS CABA'S CONNECTED@HOME CONFERENCE & EXPO AND FTTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE & EXPO**

Mr. Baller will address the key legal and regulatory issues that affect FTTH projects as well as recent important actions before Congress, the FCC, the states, and the courts.

His clients include the American Public Power Association (APPA), the National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (NATOA), state utility associations and municipal leagues, and individual local governments and public power utilities in more than 35 states. He has also been involved in most of the leading public communications projects in the United States over the last decade, including more than twenty municipal fiber projects.

"Jim has been instrumental in leading the way for municipalities to have the right to deploy fiber to the home. His ability to successfully challenge barriers to municipal entry in recent years and his deep knowledge of the legal issues that affect fiber projects have had a huge impact on the speed with which FTTH projects have been deployed in communities across the country," stated FTTH Executive Director and Conference Chair, Michael Dimauro. "We are delighted to have Jim address conference delegates at the 2005 conference and look forward to his update on key legal issues affecting FTTH projects."
